

Stand Up Forklift Attachment

Stand Up Forklift Attachments - IC engine powered trucks are labeled according to the fuel used. Type "G" forklifts are gasoline fueled. They meet the least requirements for fire hazards. This is the most common designation found on gasoline fueled lift trucks. Forklifts labeled "G" are not utilized in unsafe sites for obvious reasons. Type "GS" trucks are fueled by gasoline and satisfy all requirements of a Type "G" forklift and consist of different devices installed to the electrical and fuel and exhaust system so as to allow them to be used in certain dangerous places. Type "GS" trucks are utilized in similar applications to Type "EE" electric lift trucks.

Type "LP" trucks are fueled by LPG and do satisfy the minimum standard for fire hazards. This is the most widespread designation utilized on lift trucks fueled by gasoline. The forklifts labeled "LP" are not utilized in hazardous locations. Type "LPS" forklifts are LPG fueled and meet all of the standards of a Type "G" truck. They have other pieces of machines installed to the electrical system, fuel system, and exhaust system to be able to allow them to be utilized in some dangerous applications. Type "LPS" trucks are utilized in similar applications to Type "GS" and Type "EE" electric forklifts.

Type "G/LP" forklifts are dual fuel units in view of the fact that they may be operated on either gasoline or LPG with no change to the fuel system. Trucks labeled "G/LP" satisfy the minimum requirements for fire hazards. forklifts labeled "G/LP" are not utilized in dangerous sites. Type "GS/LPS" forklifts are dual fuel units as they could be operated on LPG or gasoline without any modification to the fuel system. These trucks meet all requirements of a Type "GS" or Type "LPS" truck and have other machines installed to their fuel system, exhaust system and electrical system, to be able to allow them to be utilized in certain hazardous applications. Type "GS/LPS" lift trucks are used in similar applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric forklifts.

Type "D" trucks represent diesel fueled and satisfy the minimum standards for fire hazards. These lift trucks labeled "D" are not used in hazardous places. Type "DS" lift trucks are fueled by diesel and meet all requirements of a Type "D" truck and comprise different equipment installed to the exhaust system, electrical system and fuel system to be able to allow them to be used in certain unsafe locations. Type "DS" lift trucks are utilized in comparable applications to Type "GS", Type "LPS" and Type "EE" electric lift trucks. Type "DY" trucks are diesel fueled and meet all the requirements of Type "DS" lift trucks and in addition do not comprise whatever electrical devices installed. These use air starters and include provisions for controlling the temperature of truck parts. These type forklifts are used in similar application to the Type "EE" electric lift trucks.
